Livestock Mortality Composting Certification



The livestock industry is faced with discovering innovative and economical ways to dispose of mortality losses. This need has been brought on by concerns over potential ground water pollution from burials and the economic/environmental issues of incineration. Composting of dead animals is an option that is available to all livestock producers but producer need to obtain a certification by attending a training session. Composting is a natural process in which the livestock carcass is bio-degraded by bacteria to avoid pollution of air and water.

Many livestock mortality-composting facilities qualify for EQIP funding which will be discussed during this program. Along with important information on siting your facility.
